

A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR



My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We enter the Fourth Week of Lent. The Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally known as Laetare Sunday. Laetare is a Latin word that translates to rejoice. In the Gospel reading, we hear these words that are perhaps one of the most cited Gospel verses "For God so loved the world that he gave is only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life." We are invited to recognize the gift of the Cross

which is meant to bring healing to our lives. The Cross that Christ offered for our sake saying that He loves us. This is why we always encourage you to make a good confession during the season of Lent. The Sacrament of Reconciliation allows us to get rid of all the junk in our lives and be renewed with our focus in Christ. We hope that this Lenten season continues to be a source of renewal that shapes us in the love of God.

Once again, for the Season of Lent, both St John Vianney and Mary Our Queen Knights of Columbus will be hosting their Annual Fish Fries on Fridays. The proceeds support the charitable activities of the Knights of Columbus. Please join us if you are able to.

Things going on at St John Vianney:

What is left of the water damage repairs is the staining of the Church pews that were affected. We are hoping to complete this task in the next few weeks. There are also a few spots in the flat roof portion of the Church that are leaking. We are currently working to get them patched up.

We are currently upgrading the technology of our Parish with the installation of automatic locked doors for our Church building. This will allow us to give access to groups gathering to meet in Church with ease. We are also installing security cameras around the Church building as an added measure of security. We are also working on replacing our old servers and phone system.

Things going on at Mary Our Queen:

With the closing of the house next to our Early Childhood Education and Youth Center, we are now planning on working on our plans to have the house removed and to provide a space for the preschoolers to use.

We are currently scheduling the renovation of our existing playground. We will be removing the shredded mulch and replacing it with a new rubber surface. The renovation also includes the replacement of the dome in the playground and the slides in the existing playground structure.





4TH SUNDAY OF LENT – IT'S NOT TOO LATE

Here I am in the fourth week of lent. I find myself falling into a familiar trap of looking back and judging how "successful" my lent has been, even though there are a couple weeks yet to go. My inclination is to measure my success in terms of how closely I followed my Lenten resolutions. I suppose that can be one measure, but I do not think it is the best standard to use in looking at my Lenten journey.

Lent is about <u>conversion</u> and conversion cannot be effectively measured in a 7week period of time. Conversion is a lifetime process. The word "conversion" comes from the French word convertěre, which means to "turn around". During lent we are challenged to turn around or to change our focus, so we see things differently. The traditional biblical definition of conversion is to turn away from a life of sin and toward a life of faith in Jesus Christ. While that is true, that is too abstract to be of much practical help for me. I need something concrete that has everyday application to my life.

So regardless of where I am in terms of the resolutions that I made at the beginning of lent, I find it helpful to look at 3 areas of my daily life:

1. Prayer: Am I setting aside a regular time to relate to God every day. Relationships do not grow without spending time together.

2. Becoming less selfish: Do I continue to discern the difference between by "wants" and my "needs" with the goal of disciplining myself away from unnecessary attachments that have no real value for me but may be feeding my selfishness.

3. Becoming more "others centered": There are a lot of terms for this, but Jesus tells us that loving our neighbor is of utmost importance. Our "neighbor" is really everyone God puts into our path, and it starts at home with our family members.

If I continue to strive to incorporate 1. and 2. above into my daily life, I will inevitably get better at 3. And Jesus tells us that, we will be judged on love alone.

So, Lenten resolutions are good if they help me in one of these 3 areas. But the better question for me is: am I willing to continue focusing on incorporating 1, 2 and 3 into my daily life as I go forward past lent? Conversion is a lifetime journey, so it is never too late.

GOSPEL REFLECTION FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Our national pastime isn't baseball. It's what the Bible calls "condemning the world." We generally enjoy pronouncing curses upon those whom we see as trouble, wrong, or evil. Don't believe me? Listen to almost any podcast, cable news network, or social media platform to hear it. It will be some version of: "We all agree that if they are eradicated, things will be great." Condemning is almost always clothed in virtue. It basks in its good intentions. That's why it is so attractive. Condemning seems like our best path to saving what is good.

What a shock, then, to hear Jesus announce: "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him" (Jn 3:17). He comes to save the world, as we all want, but he will accomplish it without an act of condemnation. How hard it is to accept this! Condemning feels godlike. I judge who and what must be lost to protect the good. But in the light of Jesus' endless mercy and love, this is the least godlike thing we can do.

Lenten challenge: This week, I invite you to give up the delicious experience of condemning whomever in the world you most would like to see gone. Perhaps write down their names. Secondly, I invite you to consider fasting from any media that feeds the tasty but deadly tendency to condemn.
