A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR



My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We enter into Holy week. This Sunday is called Palm Sunday where we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem where the people waved palm branches and greeted Jesus as a sign of respect The Palm Sunday services include the Gospel reading of the Passion narrative – the account of his suffering and crucifixion. The colors used in this weekend's

liturgy of red and white symbolizes the redemption Christ paid for the world with his sacrifice and blood.

On Monday, the priests of our Archdiocese will gather with our Archbishop for the Chrism Mass where the holy oils are blessed by our Archbishop that will be used for sacraments and rituals. The Oil of the Sick will be used in the Sacrament of the anointing of the sick to bring healing and strengthening. The Oil of Catechumens will be used before baptism to signify cleansing and strengthening, and the Sacred Chrism is used for Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination to signify consecration.

We invite you if you have not had the chance to make a good confession. Please note the times for confessions in our bulletin.

Thursday marks the beginning of our Easter Tridium. It is known as the Mass of the Lord's Supper where we commemorate Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples. At the end of the Mass the altar is stripped in preparation for Good Friday. After the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we are invited to participate in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament till midnight. This tradition represents the disciples who were invited to stay up with the Lord during his agony in the garden before He was betrayed by Judas.

Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ. It is a day of fast and abstinence where we are invited to reflect on God's love and promise of eternal life that gives us hope.

The Easter Vigil celebrates the resurrection of our Lord that takes place during nightfall. For us Christians, this is the most Holy of all solemnities in our Church. At the Easter Vigil, we will welcome all those in our RCIA program into our Church.

Please note the times for our liturgies in our Family of Parishes for Holy Week.







The Feast of Corpus Christi and the Eucharist

Today's Gospel reading gives us the opportunity to address the Eucharistic "Year" which began on Thursday, June 16, 2022, the **Feast of Corpus Christi**, and will conclude this year (2024) with the **National Eucharistic Congress** in Indianapolis from July 17 to 20. (Yeah, I know that is more than one year, but that's the church for you.)

The Feast of Corpus Christi, also known as the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body** and Blood of Christ, celebrates the **Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus** in the appearance of the bread and wine of the Eucharist. The institution of the Holy Eucharist at the **Last Supper** is observed in the gospel readings on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday and in the Consecration at every Mass all year, every year.

History

Instrumental in promoting the adoption of the Feast of Corpus Christi was St. Juliana of Belgium. From her early youth, Juliana had a great love for the Blessed Sacrament and always desired a special feast in its honor. This desire is said to have been increased by a vision of the Church under the appearance of the full moon having one dark spot, which signified the absence of such a feast. She made known her ideas to three main leaders of the church: Bishop Robert de Thorete of Liege, Belgium, the learned Dominican priest and later Cardinal Hugh, and Jacques Pantaleon, eventually Pope Urban IV. Bishop Robert was favorably impressed, and, since bishops at that time had the right of ordering the celebration of feasts for their dioceses, ordered the celebration to be held in 1247.

Bishop Robert who died in October 1246 did not live to see the execution of his order. Jacques Pantaleon became Pope Urban IV on 29 August 1261. Pope Urban was requested to extend the celebration to the entire world. He always was an admirer of the feast and ordered the annual celebration of Corpus Christi.

The death of Pope Urban IV (2 October 1264), shortly after the publication of the decree, somewhat blocked the spread of the feast. Pope Clement V, pope from 1305 to 1314, took the matter in hand and, at the Council of Vienne (1311), once more ordered the worldwide adoption of the feast. He published a new decree which embodied that of Pope Urban's decree. Pope John XXII, pope from 1316 to 1334 and successor of Pope Clement V, also urged its observance. *Source for historical information: www.newadvent.org/Feast of Corpus Christi*

GOSPEL REFLECTION PALM SUNDAY

A few months before they married, my twenty-three-year-old sister and her fiancé planned a cross-country road trip to visit his family. My parents told them that they could only go if they slept in separate hotel rooms, offering to foot the bill. It might sound prudish, but my parents wanted the young couple to understand that their approaching unity was close, but not yet. Patience solidifies love.

What could this possibly have to do with Palm Sunday? It's usually overlooked, but the Gospels tell us that, after entering Jerusalem, Jesus "looked around ... and since it was late, went out to Bethany with the twelve" (Mk 11:11) for the night. Who cares? Why include this detail? Jews in those days believed that the new Davidic King would one day re-enter and "marry" the city. A new future marked by fidelity would begin for God's people. Israel's God would be in union with His people forever. Without over-sexualizing the metaphor, perhaps Jesus refused to sleep in Jerusalem to remind us of his marital purpose. He was entering Jerusalem as the bridegroom-king. It was almost time, but not yet. Soon he will sleep in Jerusalem in the tomb and then something new will begin: his one body, his Church.

Lenten challenge: This Holy Week, I challenge you to keep this image in your mind all the way until Easter Sunday: Jesus is the faithful bridegroom who patiently prepares his bride for their new life together. Go to the Good Friday liturgy and kiss the cross. When you do, let that gesture be the long-awaited "I do" to our faithful God, who always waits for us.
